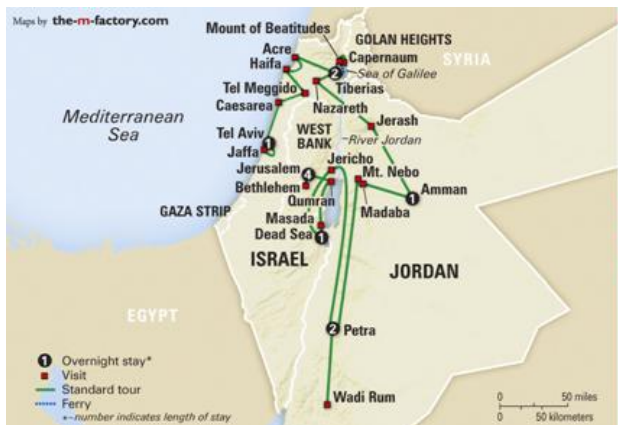

Day 1: Monday, March 19, 2012

Depart from Honolulu - Overnight Flight

Day 3: Wednesday, March 21, 2012

Arrive Tel Aviv, Israel - Tour Begins
 Your tour begins in Tel Aviv. Tonight, join your fellow travelers for a welcome dinner. *Today dinner will be included.*

Day 4: Thursday, March 22, 2012

Tel Aviv - Jaffa - Caesarea - Haifa - Acre - Tiberias

Stroll through the ancient port city of Jaffa before continuing to the ruins of Caesarea, built by Herod the Great in 22 B.C. Visit the Roman Theatre, Aqueduct and Fortress. Enjoy a panoramic view of Haifa and the Baha'i Shrine and Gardens on Mount Carmel (UNESCO World Heritage site). Travel the

Valley of Armageddon to the excavation site of Tel Megiddo. Visit the ancient Crusader city of Acre (UNESCO) before arriving in Tiberias. *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*

Day 5: Friday, March 23, 2012
Tiberias

Visit the Mt. of Beatitudes before proceeding to Capernaum. Cross the River Jordan to visit the Golan Heights. **Enjoy a cruise on the Sea of Galilee in a replica boat from the time of Jesus Christ. Next, experience lunch at a Kibbutz, a traditional communal settlement.** The remainder of your day is at leisure to explore Tiberias. *Today breakfast, lunch and dinner will be included.*

Day 6: Saturday, March 24, 2012
Tiberias-Nazareth-Jordan Valley Border Crossing-Jerash, Jordan-Amman

Visit the Church of the Annunciation and Mary's Well in Nazareth. **Cross into Jordan and the city of Jerash, the "Pompeii of the East."** Tour the ruins, walk along the paved and columned streets, hilltop temples and public squares and plazas. Continue to Amman, Jordan's capital city. *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*

Day 7: Sunday, March 25, 2012
Amman - Madaba - Mt. Nebo - Petra

Travel Kings Highway, lined with prehistoric villages from the Stone Age, biblical towns, Roman fortresses and Islamic settlements. **In Madaba, the "City of Mosaics," visit the church of St. George to see a 6th century Byzantine mosaic map.**

Next, stop at a mosaic shop to learn the history of this ancient art. Travel to Mt. Nebo where Moses saw the Promised Land – present day Israel – and is believed to be laid to rest. Visit Shobak Castle, a 12th century crusader castle. Your day ends in the ancient city of Petra. *Today breakfast will be included.*

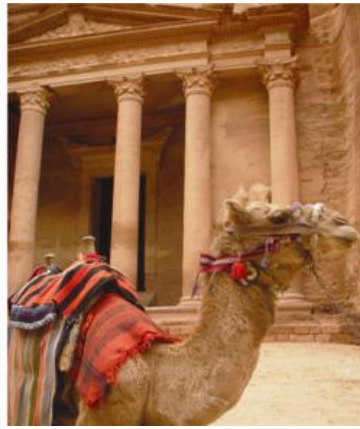
Day 8: Monday, March 26, 2012
Petra - Wadi Rum - Petra

Tour the remarkable city of Petra (UNESCO), one of the new Wonders of the World. Petra was "hidden" behind mountains prior to its discovery in 1812. With an expert guide, explore this city carved from sandstone by the Nabataeans. Then, depart for the desert of Wadi Rum, home of the famous film "Lawrence of Arabia." Tonight, enjoy dinner at a traditional Bedouin camp. Learn about the history of the Bedouin people who have lived for generations in the Wadi Rum's stark, fragile desert. *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*

Day 9: Tuesday, March 27, 2012

Petra - Allenby Bridge Border Crossing - Jericho, Israel - Dead Sea

Return to Israel and continue to Jericho which is considered to be the oldest city on earth. Later, arrive in the Dead Sea, the lowest body of water on Earth. The remainder of the day is at leisure to relax, experience the Dead Sea's waters or perhaps take in a spa treatment*. *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*



Day 10: Wednesday, March 28, 2012

Dead Sea - Masada - Qumran - Jerusalem

Travel the shores of the Dead Sea to the former palatial fortress of Masada (UNESCO), originally Herod's fortress. **Ascending Masada by cable car, visit Herod's Palaces, the Roman Camp and the Synagogue.** In Qumran, tour the area where the ancient Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered. This evening you arrive in Jerusalem and join a local expert in discovering the treasures of Jerusalem by night, a beacon of three faiths. By bus enjoy stunning views of the Old City walls, Temple Mount and Mount Zion. On foot, walk through Jaffa gate to the Old City, (UNESCO) which combines the beauty of what is old with an allure that is timeless and visit the Citadel (also known as the Tower of David). The walls of the Citadel serve as a stage for a "Night Spectacular" show which is a celebration of sight and sound. Amidst the archaeological remains in the Citadel's courtyard and to the sound of original music, the story of Jerusalem unfolds through giant breathtaking, virtual reality images. Explore the Jewish Quarter, harboring thousands of years of history where echoes of history meet the voices of the present day. Discover hidden archways, spiraling stairways, and arrive at the Wailing Wall, the holiest place of Judaism and the single most visited site in Jerusalem. The Wailing Wall attracts visitors from all over the world and of all faiths and denominations. It stands as the

only reminder of the Holy Temple and is visited by thousands every day. This tour includes walking and coach transportation, local guide and entrance to the sound & light show. *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*

Day 11: Thursday, March 29, 2012

Old City - Bethlehem - Jerusalem

A tour of the Holy City of Jerusalem begins with a drive to the old walled city. While walking through the Old City (UNESCO), visit the Western (Wailing) Wall, the Temple Area, Dome of the Rock, Pool of Bethesda, and the Church of St. Anne. Then, walk the path of the Stations of the Cross as you traverse the Via Dolorosa, beginning at Pilate's Judgment Hall and ending at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. **A stop in Bethlehem, spread along the Judean Hills, allows for a visit to the Church of the Nativity, the birthplace of Jesus and the first church ever built.** *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*

Day 12: Friday, March 30, 2012

Jerusalem

Today you will visit Yad Vashem, a world center for documentation, research, education and commemoration of the Holocaust. As the Jewish people's living memorial to the Holocaust, Yad Vashem safeguards the memory of the past and imparts its meaning for future generations. Spend time exploring the many exhibits

from all over the world. Later, travel to nearby Ein Karem (Spring of the Vineyard). According to Christian tradition, this is the site where John the Baptist was born. Visit the Church of St. John the Baptist and the Church of Visitation, said to be built over the home of John the Baptist's parents. Lunch is included while you enjoy a beautiful view of the valley and the surrounding wooded hills. *Today breakfast and lunch will be included.*

Day 13: Saturday, March 31, 2012

Jerusalem

Drive to Mount of Olives for a panoramic view of the city of Jerusalem. Proceed to the Church of Ascension and the Garden of Gethsemane to view the Kidron Valley and the tombs of Mary, Absalom Zachariah and James. **Visit St. Peter in Gallicantu and Mt. Zion to see the room of The Last Supper and the tomb of King David.** View a scale model of Jerusalem and visit the Shrine of the Book at the Israel Museum to view the display of the Dead Sea Scrolls. You'll also visit the Garden Tomb. Join your fellow travelers for a farewell dinner celebrating this once-in-a-lifetime trip. *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*

Day 14: Sunday, April 01, 2012

Jerusalem - Tour Ends

Board your international flight home.

Today breakfast will be included.

Experience It! _____ **Jerusalem's Old City: A Confluence of Faiths**

Enter its sacred gates and meander its labyrinth of winding cobblestone streets densely packed in an area covering less than one square mile. In spite of its diminutive size, the walled Old City is of great symbolic importance for Judaism, Christianity and Islam. Your journey with Collette includes venerable locations which have existed for thirty centuries. Walk along the Via Dolorosa or Way of Sorrows to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, the site of Jesus Christ's crucifixion, burial and resurrection. Observe the solemnity of the Western Wall, the only surviving remnant of Judaism's most sacred shrine, the Temple Mount; and gaze in awe at one of the world's great architectural masterpieces, the Dome of the Rock. To the Muslims it is where the Prophet Muhammad ascended to heaven.

Due to flight schedules, you may require a very early morning departure from the hotel on the last day (Day 13). Travel distance from Jerusalem to Tel Aviv's Ben Gurion airport is approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes. It is recommended that you arrive at Ben Gurion airport approximately 3 hours prior to departure.

Collette air passengers will depart from the Tel Aviv airport and all Collette transfers will depart from Jerusalem for the Tel Aviv airport.

This tour includes moderate physical activity. The itinerary blends some longer days with shorter days and more leisure time. Walking tours, as well as walking slightly longer distances, up stairs or on uneven walking surfaces should be expected.
